Animal welfare

The Animal Welfare service ensures that domestic and wild animals live in balance in our urban environment, in the interests of both themselves, their owners and society. In particular, they give small grants for the sterilisation of domestic cats (males and females) and for the adoption of domestic animals from approved shelters in the Brussels-Capital Region, ensure the sterilisation of stray cats and the capture and housing of stray, lost or abandoned animals (as well as euthanasia in cases where the health of the animals justifies it), and remove animal corpses.




The service also coordinates the Consultative Council for Animal Welfare, which responds to questions and reports of stray, abandoned, lost or mistreated animals and works closely with various associations, including the Royal Belgian League for the Protection of Birds.

WANT TO BE NOTIFIED IMMEDIATELY IN THE EVENT OF AN EMERGENCY SITUATION?

Be-Alert is a system that allows municipalities to send text messages and e-mails to people on their territory during an emergency. If you subscribe to the system, you can indicate several addresses: your home town, your children's school, your parents' residential care centre, etc.

If a fire, flood or other incident occurs near one of the addresses, you will be quickly informed and receive safety instructions.

Your data will only be used for this purpose.

The 12-hectare site can be explored like a miniature city, with its tree-lined alleys, roundabouts, islands and views. A large number of famous people are buried there, such as violinist Eugène Ysaye, industrialist Ernest Solvay, choreographer Akarova and sculptor Constantin Meunier. This «little Père Lachaise» was listed in 2016.

(Public) cleanliness

The Public Cleanliness Department is responsible for sweeping and for emptying public litter bins on municipal roads. It also intervenes in the event of clogged drains, illegal dumping, tag removal and bulky items collection by appointment.

Graffiti removal

Any Ixelles resident who is a victim of a tag or graffiti can contact the service for the free cleaning of the tagged surface.

Home collection of bulky waste and appliances.

Every Ixelles household is entitled to three free home collections of bulky waste or household appliances per year (max. 3 m³). Make an appointment by phone or email.

Mobile waste collection centres

Each year, the municipality organises several mobile waste collection days in the different districts of Ixelles, in collaboration with the regional agency Bruxelles-Propreté. To find out the next dates, consult the municipality's website or contact the service by phone or email.

Household Waste Collection

In the Brussels Region, domestic waste must be placed in front of your home during the authorised hours and using the bags provided by the Bruxelles-Propreté regional agency. Visit the Bruxelles-Propreté website for more information: www.arp-gan.be

Illegal dumping

It is strictly forbidden to dump any type of waste in the public space, with the exception of household waste during collection hours (see above). Illegal dumping can lead to an administrative fine of up to \le 350 and \le 62,500 for regional fines.

Pavement maintenance

As a resident of our municipality, you also have an obligation to maintain the pavement in front of your home. This includes the removal of small items of rubbish and weeds and as well as snow removal in winter.

Soiling of the public space

It is strictly forbidden to soil the public space in any way. The term «soiling» refers to packaging waste, cigarette butts, spit, dog waste, public urination, graffiti, etc.

The municipality has a Tree Plan that aims to make Ixelles less concrete and plant trees wherever possible.

What should you do if you lose an umbrella, a sports bag or any other object that is particularly important to you while you are in Ixelles? First of all, you must report the loss of an object to the Police (not necessarily to a police station in Ixelles). The police will send the description of the object and the owner's contact details to «Lost and Found». If the object is found, the person is informed by a summons inviting him or her to collect it from the Lost and Found Service. They must bring an identity document and/or a declaration of theft or loss issued by the police.

If the loss has occurred on STIB/MIVB premises or in public transport, it is advisable to contact their **Customer Service - Lost and Found** 070 23 2000 (€0.30/min).

The Ixelles Museum presents a vast panorama of Belgian art from the 19th and 20th centuries. Its collections include paintings and drawings from the impressionist, symbolist and pressureist movements. It also has a collection of posters by de Toulouse-Lautrec.

Temporary exhibitions liven up the place and add to the museum's reputation beyond the borders of the region.



The Ixelles Museum will be closed until 2024 due to renovation and expansion.



The ombudsman is impartial, not taking sides with either the citizen or the administration. It works to reconcile the views of the citizen and the administrative department concerned.








The pool is currently closed due to extensive renovations. The beautiful setting will be preserved and the pool will better meet today's hygiene and comfort requirements.
